The XHS Marching Band earned second place honors in the Jackson Apple Festival Parade of Bands on Saturday, September 21, 2019 in the Class B category. Also, the XHS Color Guard earned 1st place honors in the Class B category for the second consecutive year.. Congratulations to all!

XHS Chemistry teacher Bill Richey will take learning outside the classroom when he takes his honors and College Credit Plus/AP Chemistry students on a fantastic, fun-filled and educational trip to Florida May 15 through 20, 2020. Students will be visiting Kennedy Space Center, where they will have the opportunity to explore the wonders of space and interact with many exhibits that review the history of the space program, including the new space shuttle Atlantis exhibit. While on the East coast, the students will visit Canaveral National Seashore, part of America's National Park System. The National Seashore has been dubbed by park rangers as the one of the most scenic and beautiful beaches in America. While at Canaveral, students will work with National Park Rangers on a sea turtle project and do seining in the Indian River Lagoon. Students will also kayak near Kennedy Space Center on the Indian River where hundreds of manatees can be found. They will also visit Wekiwa Springs, a State Park that features the largest natural springs (putting millions of gallons per hour into the state's aquifer) in the State of Florida that students can swim in and canoe down the alligator-infested river. Along with canoeing with alligators and other wildlife, students will conduct water testing to discover the purity of natural spring water. One of the greatest learning experiences of the trip will be when students visit Walt Disney World where they will participate in one of Disney's Youth Educational Services programs. These highly structured and Common Core-aligned programs have students going behind the scenes to learn the secrets behind many of the attractions in a program called Properties of Motion Physics Lab. Students will learn how properties of force, motion and gravity bring their favorite attractions to life. For many students, this trip will be their first experience flying on an airplane. For over half of the students on the trip, it will be their first time out of Ohio and will be their first trip to Florida. One thing is certain for all who will be attending-this will be an educational trip of a lifetime!
